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# WORKPLACE ANSWERS

## Campuses Under Fire From Task Force

Responding to [startling statistics](#) and renewed student activism, the *White House Task Force to Protect Students from Assault* published its first report detailing how government agencies and universities will address violence on college campuses. The full summary, with Resources to implement these ideas, is [available here](#).

The Report outlines 4 objectives:

1. **Identify the Problem** – Campuses are “urged” to conduct a Campus Climate Survey during the winter or spring semester of 2015. The survey will most likely be mandatory by 2016.
2. **Prevent Assault** – [Prevention training programs](#) must be in place, with a focus on Bystander Intervention and “Men as Allies.”
3. **Respond Effectively** – Campus policies and the definition of “consent” should be re-evaluated and include Student involvement. It is recommended that campuses partner with community organizations.
4. **Improve Enforcement and Transparency** – The Dept. of Education’s Office of Civil Rights will be more visible on campus, data will be released and [www.NotAlone.gov](#) updated.
