

## Impact/Space Committee Minutes

Tuesday August 20, 2013

### Parking Policy Update:

- The start of the new parking policy has been deferred from Fall 2013 to Spring 2014.
- The change was made in due in part to problematic timing. Leadership wanted everyone to have time to get comfortable with the policy.
- Stickers will be available for purchase through our parking portal towards the end of the fall semester. Currently working with Rydin to build our portal and get it live.
- David is happy to answer any questions that anyone (Faculty, Staff, or Students) have in regards to parking. He is willing to do parking forums if the interest arises.

### NexDine Update:

- Jitters is being completely re-done. New paint job, carpets are being ripped up, new furniture. Jitters will be up and running by September 4.
- NexDine is trying to come up with solutions to concerns that have been raised in regards to price, ordering, ect...
- Food Service subcommittee (lead by Ernie Greenslade, members Maggie Lucey and Erin Galvin) are working on ways to get the word out about new food service. FAQ's on the school website, e-mails, social media, and posters will be used to get the information out there
- Food Service in Dimity will be up and running by September 4<sup>th</sup>. Sal's is working to get a name brand into 420 Common Street.

### New Information Post Card:

- Postcard highlighting all the new happenings on campus was passed around. It will be mailed out to staff and students this week.
- Includes a link to our website to go online and get even more information about the changes.

### UMass Lowell Update:

- UML is now on campus. They are currently in a conference room in the Tech Center, but will be moved downstairs to a more permanent spot.
- We are asking UML to come up with an ID plan so we can identify their students who are on campus.

### Campus Liquor Policy:

- Allison is losing lots of potential business due to our no alcohol policy on campuses.
- Outside groups that want to use our facilities for after work events where drinks are served can't because of the policy. Loss of business means loss of money.

- Policy is self-imposed. It is not in the college by-laws.
- Many of the other community colleges within the state have a policy that allows some alcohol on campus.

**Shuttles/ID's:**

- MVRTA will begin running between Lawrence and Haverhill campuses starting on September 4<sup>th</sup>.
- You must show your ID to ride the bus for free.
- ID schedule will be sent to students, times and places that they can get ID's.
- Another ID set up for the library would cost between 5-6k.
- For now, increase the hours to see if the demand for more ID hours is needed, then we can think about purchasing more equipment
