12-10	Continue to increase retention rates for Criminal Justice Program students through focusing on students in CRJ 101 – Introduction to Criminal Justice.	02-12	The completion rate for the fall 2010, CRJ 101 Early Intervention Project Pilot section was <u>80.1 %</u> . (N=26, C- grade or better) This is in comparison to a 59% completion rate based on data for all sections of CRJ 101 in the Spring 2009 semester. Additional Early Intervention sections of CRJ 101 will be run in the AY 2012-213 contingent upon obtaining additional resource allocations from the college.
		03-13	The overall completion rate for all sections of CRJ 101 was 73.5 %. (Fall 2011), a 3.5% increase from the previous year.
		04-14	<i>Fall 2013 completion rate data for all CRJ 101 sections is not available for comparison but selected sections of CRJ 101, that implemented Early Intervention Strategies, resulted in a completion rate of 87% in the Fall 2013 semester. (Fall 2012- 82% & Fall 2011- 67%)</i>
12-10	Need to develop methods and gather data related to evaluating student success in both transfers to four-year colleges and careers in law enforcement.	02-12	A Criminal Justice graduate survey is scheduled to be finalized at the Spring 2012 semester meeting of the Criminal Justice Advisory Board.
		03-13	A proposed CJ Graduate Survey was discussed at the Fall 2012 semester meeting of the Criminal Justice Advisory Board with final approval anticipated at the Spring 2013 meeting. (Agenda of 12/12/12 meeting attached)

		04-14	<i>A graduate survey has been developed but more effective participation level strategies are needed. Consideration is being given to use the Criminal Justice Club Facebook page as a format to reach more graduates. The CJ Club Facebook is currently used by both current and former students to keep updated on training opportunities and job postings.</i>
12-10	Need to re-activate Program Advisory Committee.	<p>02-12</p> <p>03-13</p> <p>04-14</p>	<p>The Criminal Justice Advisory Board was re-initiated in the fall semester of 2010.
