- Kudos to the "Environmental Awareness Month" activities flyer on the NECC website;
- A college-wide e-mail dated April 2009 was sent regarding our Committee and our NECC "Green" accomplishments;
- VP Wolfe submitted NECC's wish list to DCAM. Over 70% of what is requested is energy related (lighting for the General Services ("B") and Science ("E") buildings, roof replacement at 45 Franklin Street campus, conversation of gas from electric at the Gym, etc.) Cost savings to the College will be considerable in the next 10-15 years;
  - It was suggested that we look in to the possibility of installing a meter in the General Services "B" building to show kw hours?
- The Solar Panel project for buildings "B" & "E" should be going forward. We should hear news by July 1<sup>st</sup>;
- Energy Star appliances will be purchased for the school but not PCs;
- Alison Cody will relook the "New Trees Grant Proposal" in May;
- Committee members decided that the two (2) major areas that we will focus on to reduce our carbon footprint are "Energy Consumption Reduction (gas, electricity)" and "Student Commuting".
  - Discussion arose regarding student commuting.
    - Can we change the way that students get to school?
    - Create a site for student carpooling? (Facebook?);
    - Jessica Cogswell will look at what other college campuses are presently doing regarding commuting;
