The assignment will require the student to:

- Define the scope of a research question or thesis.
- Select a variety of credible sources appropriate to the topic
- Cite all sources ethically in an appropriate style
- Demonstrate an understanding of the research process (for instance, documenting their research process in some way)

\_\_\_\_\_ 2. One or more assignments will require students to actively engage with evaluating sources for credibility and relevance.

\_\_\_\_\_ 3. One or more assignments will require students to make use of NECC library resources, for example: books, electronic books, general and/or subject specific databases.

Students will be required to demonstrate an understanding of the difference between: web sources and library databases, scholarly and popular sources, and/or primary and secondary sources.

NOTE: Criteria 2 & 3 can be met either as a part of the research-based assignment in #1, or as stand-alone assignments at the instructor's discretion.

\_\_\_\_\_4. Students will meet with reference librarians at least twice. A typical model for in person classes is once during a class session, and a one-on-one librarian/student appointment outside class. 100% online classes may have a library guide that can be embedded in Blackboard and students can set up virtual appointments with librarians. These models are flexible, however, and can be adjusted to meet course needs. Librarians are happy to assist with this process.
