<b>Organization</b> (10 points)	The type of presentation is appropriate for the topic and audience.	5	
	Information is presented in a logical sequence.	5	
<b>Content</b> (55 points)	Introduction is attention-getting, states the objective, lays out the problem well, and establishes a framework for the rest of the presentation.	15	
	If technical terms are used, they are well-defined in language appropriate for the audience. Avoids excessive jargon.	5	
	Presentation contains accurate information on the relevant philosopher.	10	
	Material included is relevant to the overall message/purpose.	10	
	Appropriate amount of material is prepared, and points made reflect well their relative importance.	10	
	There is an obvious conclusion summarizing the presentation, but doesn't claim more than was established in the body of the presentation.	15	
<b>Presentation</b> (25 points)	Speaker maintains good eye contact with the audience and is appropriately animated (e.g., gestures, moving around, etc.).	5	
	Speaker uses a clear, audible voice.	5	
	Good language skills and pronunciation are used. (It is important to be familiar with the terms before presenting.)	5	
	If visual aids are used, they are well prepared, informative, effective, legible, and not distracting.	5	
	Length of presentation is within the assigned time limits. Long enough to do justice to the material, but not so long as to show that editing was neglected.	5
